

Students in Mr. Jefferson Clavel's AP Spanish Class demonstrated remarkable academic prowess during the 2023 AP exams. Boston Prep scholars maintained a higher pass rate than other test takers in Massachusetts and globally. Additionally, 42% of students received a score of 5, which is 18% higher than the global average.

INFUSING OUR CURRICULUM WITH **ETHICS**

Ethics classes were reinstated for Middle School students during the 2022-2023 school year. Ethics courses speak directly to our mission - preparing students to succeed in four-year colleges and embody, in thought and action, *lifelong ethical growth*. Classes covered topics including respect, responsibility, and integrity. The course concludes with an ethics roundtable that families are invited to. Students debate ethical quandaries as a part of their promotion to high school.

TRANSFORMING OUR **CURRICULUM**

Boston Prep is working to enhance and strengthen our mathematics program through implementing a more dynamic and comprehensive curriculum. Last year, DESE awarded Boston Prep the High Quality Instructional Materials (HQIM) Implementation Grant. This grant is intended to support “evidence-based, culturally responsive, inclusive, and equitable implementation of high-quality materials.”

During the 2022-2023 school year, Boston Prep's Art III students partnered with Hands House Studio and Zoo New England to create enrichment feeders and toys for Cotton Top Tamarins. Hands House is a non-profit, educational organization that works with various communities, schools, and institutions to create a variety of innovative projects.



“Environmental enrichment lets animals use their natural abilities and behaviors to interact with their surroundings. After learning about tamarins and how they move, eat and act in their environment, the students designed and built contraptions that let the animals climb and explore while foraging for their nutritious insects and fruit.”

Kicking off the project, students visited Franklin Park Zoo to gain a better understanding of the Cottton Top Tamarins, their habitats, and the importance of enrichment feeders. Senior Zoo Keeper and Enrichment Committee Chair Christina Demetrio educated our students on some of the best practices when considering their designs. Students took notes, drafted sketches, and brainstormed their ideas for enrichment toys and feeders. Finished projects included a feeder box, sliding log toy, and a standing slide feeder.

“It was an **amazing experience** being able to work with Hands House and Franklin Park Zoo to create a tangible learning moment for our students. From seeing the animals live, meeting with professional industrial designers and zoologists, to learning how to use a power tool for the first time. **This project taught our students so many skills that I know they will be able to take with them on their next chapter in life.**”

Changing Summer at Camp Beyond

Summer enrichment is a crucial aspect of the Boston Prep experience. During the summer of 2023, we expanded to our robust summer enrichment offerings beyond high school to our middle school scholars.

Camp Beyond is a part of the organization Change Summer whose mission is to “provide students from under-resourced communities with a summer experience that increases independence, curiosity, confidence, and responsibility – all critical skills for a successful future.” Beyond campers stayed at Westfield State University where they spent their July participating in athletics, STEM workshops, social-emotional activities, art classes, and various nature adventures.

Because of your support, all of our participants were able to attend Camp Beyond **free of charge**. We recognize that these experiences are invaluable to our students and we are deeply appreciative of the members of our Phoenix community who were able to make this possible for our young scholars.
