At Boston Prep, student support doesn't stop at graduation. When our graduates enter college, we continue to provide the support our alumni need to make their dreams a reality, including personalized coaching, professional development opportunities, book stipends, and emergency financial support. Our Persistence Project deeply supports college access & college success for all.

The Persistence Team would help Eve look over her college schedule to make sure she had the credits needed to graduate. "(The Persistence Team) is here to help you. Don't be afraid to reach out. They've helped me in so many ways. They're a resource for you." Boston Prep later helped Eve land an internship at Commonwealth Financial Network. When asked what she wants to do after graduation, Eve replied, "I want to create a program for students with learning disabilities, starting from high school and then extending all the way through their college career and their first job - basically helping them through that process."

Meet Eve Bourjolly, Boston Prep Class of 2018. Eve currently attends UMass Boston double majoring in English and Africana Studies.

Eve transferred to UMass Boston during her sophomore year in order to avoid a substantial student loan debt. Boston Prep's persistence team supported her

decision and helped her navigate the daunting transfer process. Soon after Eve started her classes at UMass Boston, the Covid-19 pandemic hit and she was left feeling completely overwhelmed. Her parents contracted Covid, she began to struggle in one of her math classes, and she was responsible for taking care of her two little brothers while her parents recovered. Needing support, Eve again reached out to Boston Prep's Persistence Team. They immediately helped her find a math tutor and sent over multiple Uber Eats gift cards so Eve wouldn't have to worry about cooking dinner for her family.



Madison R. BP '25 spent one week at Harvard Medical School, participating in Harvard's MEDScience program. Madison's goal is to attend medical school one day, but as a high school sophomore she is still deciding what medical specialty she wants to study. The MEDScience program allowed her to learn about different medical fields and pathways she can take.

- Jaylen O. BP '23 spent his summer at Tulane University studying Neuroscience. After flying out to Louisiana and settling into this dorm room, Jaylen spent the next few weeks studying the electrical activity of the human brain and preparing brain tissue to examine under a microscope.
- Becky C. BP '24 participated in the five week SMASH Academy program at Northeastern University. SMASH is a pre-college program for students interested in pursuing a career in STEM. Students participate in the program for three summers before graduating, allowing participants to build strong lifelong connections with one another.
- Kerri BP '26, Mairead BP '26, and Jhanelle BP '25 took part in the MassArt Artward Bound program, a multi-week program where students take Math and ELA classes that connect to art, as well as various art classes for illustration, film, story telling, architecture and more.
