In these final weeks of school, you will receive your ELA summer reading book for next school year. Here is some important information about summer reading:

- Each grade level has a summer reading book and an accompanying assignment or evidence tracker, and **every student is expected to complete their summer reading assignment by the first day of school**, which will be Monday, August 25, 2025.
 - If you are enrolled in summer school and/or unsure about your promotion status, please reach out to your school principal for more information about which summer reading assignment you will be expected to complete.
- You may complete the assignment on paper, in your notebook, or digitally. If you choose to complete it digitally, please make a copy of the appropriate document, linked below. The assignment document also includes more detailed instructions.
- If you are a new student or you are a current student who missed book distribution, you will be able to pick up what you need from the carts next to the front desk at Boston Prep, during the school's summer hours, which are Monday through Friday, 8:00AM–12:30PM..

Remember, **completing summer reading is crucial for a strong start to the school year**. You do not want to be behind on the first day of school because you failed to complete the summer reading assignment. If you have extenuating circumstances, then you must communicate them in advance.
